

Deep Cleaning Ruminant and Equine Barns

At least once a year, the barns get a thorough deep cleaning to keep them fresh, keep out pests, and keep the animals' home safe for them.

Supplies:

- Broom & shovel
- Wheelbarrow
- Scrub brushes
- Gloves
- Rescue (diluted)
- Pressure washer (if water level at the sanctuary is okay)
- Stall Dry (water absorption pellets)
- Giant fan (if needed)

Directions:





1. Clean out stall of all shavings and hay (this includes water buckets, hay buckets, and mineral blocks).



2. Take a picture of how the mats are currently situated (you'll need this later)






- 3. Remove the mats from the stall (Note: they are extremely heavy and will require multiple people to move them).
- 4. Sweep up any debris that was under or between the mats.







5. Use the hose, pressure washer, and Rescue to clean both sides of the mats and the stall.



- 6. The large fan can be set up to help dry out the stall and/or mats.
- 7. Sprinkle Stall Dry on the floor of the stall.





8. Place the mats back in the stall, being careful to refer back to the original picture that you took. (Note: this after picture does not match the original picture, but they typically would.)

9. Replace the shavings, buckets (with water in them), and mineral blocks.
